PRIMARY 5 AMAZONIA

On Friday, 23rd October, the pupils of Primary 5 spent a wonderful day at Amazonia to launch their Rainforest topic this term. They engaged in a number of activities, the most memorable being holding a Royal Python, a tarantula and a fat-tailed gecko. Other activities included investigating bats, cockroaches, monkeys, leaf-cutter ants and interacting (quite literally) with a selection of macaws. Their final activity involved being in an interactive chamber where they played games involving Rainforest animals and plants. One in particular was catching butterflies.

PRIMARY 6 DEVELOPING COUNTRIES

Primary 6 pupils have been using their geography skills to assist in their new Humanities topic on Developing Countries, which will involve the children identifying specific difficulties experienced by those living in the developing world. Children are currently using their letter writing skills to write to various charities requesting information to further their understanding of the needs of those living in Developing Countries in a country of their choice.

PRIMARY 7 JOHN MUIR AWARD

Continuing with the successful John Muir Award Programme of the past seven years, the pupils of P7 will be heading in November to the Cambuslang Community Forest where we will take part in an exploration and discovery day led by conservationist and regular presenter of the BBC programme 'Landward', Patrick McGlinchey, and Mr Bagshaw, Head of Outdoor Education, as part of the John Muir Educational Initiative.

The John Muir Award is an Environmental Award scheme focused on wild places. This could be anywhere, from a mountain top to a city garden. It encourages the discovery and conservation of wild places, in a spirit of fun, adventure and exploration. Further details can be found at www.jmt.org

The following week the pupils will be working on a conservation project near Culzean Castle on the Ayrshire coast. Further work will be done back at school, and the pupils will share their experiences of the days in a presentation at a Junior school assembly in January. This is an excellent introduction to outdoor education and a further opportunity to take part in team building activities.

ART, SCIENCE, MUSIC & LANGUAGES ANNUAL ART EXHIBITION

On Wednesday 23rd September we held the annual Art Exhibition. The work on display was produced during our last school year and included drawings, paintings, prints, collages, designs and much more. Every spare space in the Junior School Reception was covered and it was lovely to see so many parents, family and friends at the opening of our exhibition.

ECO HALLOWEEN MASK COMPETITION

All pupils from P4 to P7 have been given the task of designing an Eco mask. The design can be in sketch books or produced in 3D. We look forward to seeing an array of imaginative and creative pieces. As many as possible will be displayed by Friday 30th October on the Eco board on the ground floor of the Junior School.

WHITELEE WINDFARM

The pupils of Primary 6 visited Whitelee Windfarm on 1^{st} September for an educational trip which typified the Jesuit ideal of learning outside the classroom.

The young Aloysians enjoyed lessons in a number of areas including science, art, geography and outdoor education. The boys and girls learned about the science behind wind turbines, and how they generate electricity, before getting the chance to design their own working mini turbines.

The boys and girls also began creating a "windfarm mural" using a 40 metre turbine blade as their canvas and learned about the many plants and animals in the area, including poisonous adders and a carnivorous plant known as a 'Round Leaved Sundew'.

We welcomed S6 Science Ambassadors into our Science classes this term. They will be helping the children with discussion and scientific enquiry skills.
