MEDICAL INFORMATION INFLUENZA FLU VACCINATION

You may have noticed the posters regarding Influenza vaccine which all P1 – P7's are being offered. The date is set for Monday, 26^{th} October. This vaccine is administered as a nasal spray and will be given by the NHS school health team.

HEAD LICE

We have had instances of head lice in recent weeks. The school policy is to treat the head lice at home and advise the School Nurse - this allows us to inform the class parents.

These must be accompanied by a letter detailing the time medication is to be administered and the amount to be given and signed by a parent/carer.
